Your Step-by-Step Guide to Fixing Dripping or Leaking Taps at Home

What You Can Legally Do in Queensland

In Queensland, homeowners can legally undertake tap repairs on their property. However, if the issue worsens, you may still need a licensed plumber, so proceed with care.

Tools You'll Need

- Adjustable spanner or tap spanner
- Tap reseating tool
- Flathead screwdriver
- O-ring and washer kit
- Silicone grease
- Bucket or towel (for spills)

Now to Fix a Leaking Spindle Tap

- 1. Turn off the water supply at the isolation valve or main water meter.
- 2. Open the tap fully to release any water in the pipes.
- 3. Remove the tap handle using a screwdriver.
- 4. **Unscrew the cover flange** to expose the tap body.
- 5. **Use the spanner** to loosen and remove the spindle.
- 6. Inspect washers and O-rings. Replace with matching new parts.
- 7. Clean and reseat if needed using the reseating tool.
- 8. Lubricate the spindle with silicone grease and reassemble.



9. Turn the water back on and check for leaks.

↑ Common DIY Mistakes to Avoid

- Using incorrect washers that don't seal properly.
- Forgetting to reseat the tap—leading to continued drips.
- Over-tightening components—causing thread damage.
- Use **hot water** while testing—always test with cold water.
